Brooklyn Center



You need to try fat biking. Fortunately, you are in (or planning to be in) Minneapolis Northwest, and we have one of the top single track trails in the Twin Cities (and the entire state of Minnesota). If that excites you, awesome! If you have no idea what it means, you're about to be introduced to your new favorite sport!

We talked to Jesse Izquierdo, Outdoor Recreation Specialist, with Three Rivers Park District and got all the information you need to get started.

Who should get into fat biking?

Everyone! But I think the sport is a great winter activity for cross-training for summer athletes and just overall recreationalists. Anyone who enjoys biking in the summer time, whether it's on regional trails or mountain biking on single tracks will enjoy it, because there is definite crossover. The great thing is that people don't need to put their bikes away anymore, it is safer to continue biking in the winter on a fat bike. The fatter tire gives people more traction and stability, on and off the trails.

So, even kids can do it?

It comes down to ability level. Kids can definitely get into this sport, you just have

to tailor it to your child or provide stepping stones for them to get comfortable with it, before throwing them out on the single track trails.

How should people get started?

I think that one of the most important things to consider before you get into fat biking is making sure you're ready for the cold temperatures. Pick up winter biking specific clothing, it will make a big difference in your experience.

From there I would check out opportunities to test out fat bikes. Some people know right away that they want to buy, but there are great demo opportunities, like at Elm Creek Park Reserve, where you can see the

bikes and try them out before you commit. Stopping into local bike shops, like Maple Grove Cycling, and checking out their demo and rental opportunities is a great starting point.



Where are the best spots to fat bike once you're all set to go?

Elm Creek Park Reserve is considered one of the top trails in the Twin Cities and the state of Minnesota. They have 13 miles of single track trail there that range anywhere from beginner to intermediate to advanced riding.

Some people may be intimidated starting on a single or narrower track trail on the snow, so they may want to start on regional trails at Elm Creek Park Reserve. Another opportunity is Lake Rebecca Park Reserve, as this will be the first year that it's open to fat bikers. There will be 14 miles of single track trail for people to enjoy.

Are there any big events people can check out if they are interested?

Absolutely! Right in Minneapolis Northwest there is the Frozen Frolic Fat Bike Race, which will be held at Elm Creek Park Reserve. It's time trial format racing a 10- to 14-mile single track loop through trees and snow. And of course there are prizes.

There are more around the Twin Cities like the QBP Fat Bike Rennet at Hyland Park Reserve, the Penn Cycle Fat Tire Loppet 35k in the Twin Cities, and the Fat Bike Birkie in Wisconsin. Check them out!

Get out there and turn our winter paradise into your biking paradise!

Award Winning Fun

Minneapolis Northwest is full of awesome parks, but if you haven't been to Central Park in Maple Grove, you're seriously missing out. This park shines all year long. On any given day you'll find children laughing and playing on the slides, climbing walls and running off their excess energy. Parents are close by relaxing and enjoying their time. You might spot people walking on the trails, enjoying a picnic on the lawn, or playing pickleball on the dedicated courts.

So it comes as no surprise that at barely a year-old Central Park has already won an

Award of Excellence from the Minnesota Recreation and Park Association! MRPA gives this award annually for new parks and facilities that made a significant impact on the community, exhibit exceptional planning, and demonstrate uniqueness and originality, which Central Park has plenty of. But then winter rears its head, and Central Park is still one of the best places to visit in Minneapolis Northwest.

Within its first year thousands of locals and visitors have enjoyed its rolling green lawn, the playground (from your childhood





dreams), the LED illuminated splash pad, and of course, the ice skating loop in the winter!

The loop is actually a trail, not like your tired old rink with bad texture. It is 800 feet of spectacular ice skating (one lap around a hockey rink is only 570 feet). And it's refrigerated and is maintained by a Zamboni, so you can live out all of your professional ice skating fantasies without any bumps in the ice. No promises on what you'll look like living out said fantasy though.

There aren't many loops or trails like this in the country, so you need to take advantage of it while you're here! Rent skates and feel like you're strolling through the park (but skating), go inside and warm up with concessions, and revel in the beauty of a Minnesota winter. There's nothing quite like it.

You'll Have 'Snow' Much Fun Learning This Sport

It can be a struggle to stay active in the winter, even our dogs might put on an extra pound or two. Minneapolis Northwest has the solution! Skijoring is the perfect way for you and your dog to get outside and take advantage of our beautiful winters!

If you already participate in Nordic skiing or dogsledding sports, you might be familiar with skijoring. If not, it's pretty simple. You start with your Nordic skis, a comfortable harness for your dog, arctic grade bungees and leashes, and a belt or harness for yourself to attach you to your dog. Then, with some guidance and training, your dog will pull you over the snow! Don't be fooled into thinking your dog does all the work (but they will love being able to get outdoors and run off all of their energy)! You'll get plenty of exercise with skijoring.

Skijoring is a great way to not only exercise, but to build a really strong bond between you and your dog. One way to get started with this, and to make your time on the trails infinitely easier, is to teach your dog some basic commands:

- Whoa = Stop
- Hike or Let's go
- Easy = Slow down
- Gee (pronounced Jee) = Right
- Haw = Left
- On-By = Keep going/ignore whatever they are being distracted by
- Line-Out = Your dog is hooked up to their harness and attached to the line. This instructs them to wait for you and your next command (and not follow you around tangling up their line).




Once your dog has the hang of things, start practicing with your skijoring gear and hit a trail! Elm Creek Park Reserve in Minneapolis Northwest has 4.3 miles of trails for you and your dog to practice and enjoy skijoring! Just remember that regardless of your level of expertise and fitness, your dog will need to start out slow and build up their stamina. Start with a mile and work your way up until you can start participating in those 10-mile events!

Now that you've fallen in love with skijoring, keep you and your dog in shape for it all year long with off season training. How? Try these:

- Canicross
- Bikejourning
- Scootering
- Nordic Walking

OMNI Brewing: Beer is Better Here

No visit to Minneapolis Northwest would be complete without a stop to one of the best breweries around: OMNI Brewing in Maple Grove. Just over a year old and already OMNI is a staple of the community. When you walk in you feel like you're hanging out at a friend's house, all the fun, none of the pretention.

Whether you just enjoy a good beer with friends or are a beer connoisseur, there is a brew for you at OMNI. Tried and true (and available year-round) classics like Lake Day and Omnipotent are guaranteed to quench your thirst and keep you asking for more. They also happen to have amazing seasonals, so make sure to ask what they have when you stop in (because you NEED to stop in).

OMNI stands apart from other breweries in more ways than one. For starters, they run on solar power! In one year they have generated enough energy to power 255 sixty-watt bulbs for one year of use at 8 hours a day. The total CO2 offset equals 805 trees and the total energy generated equals 3,624 gallons of gas saved. That's impressive for



any business, let alone a still-new one.

OMNI also believes in giving back to their community. Within their first year of business they have started a volunteer initiative called OMNI Doing Co., a volunteer group that meets to do good in the community. You get to hang out with other volunteers and enjoy OMNI beer in the taproom when you're done (that alone is worth it). Not many businesses make it their year one goals to help the



environment and the community. You are being socially responsible when you choose OMNI.

Whether you're in town for vacation, business, or you're a local tourist, OMNI Brewing has to top your list of places to visit. They offer tours and are even available for corporate functions.


For the kids:


Old Log Theatre

Sustainability, Corporate Social Responsibility, Going Green, however you refer to it, it's a big deal. characteristics, such as recycled content, renewable or salvaged materials, or are locally sourced. To top all of that off, Marriott Northwest makes education and innovation a priority. They ask guests for feedback on their green practices and they track their carbon emissions.
